
Happy Birthday ISB!

"First we learned about tally marks, we can use them to record types of transportation." "Transportation is moving from place to place." "We made tally marks for cars, buses, trucks, bikes, motorcycles, fire trucks, and police cars." "I saw many cars." "In our classroom we coloured a bar graph to show what we saw." "Graphs help us see information."







Forest School: Beach Exploration

This week, Kindergarten and Grade 1 explored the beach during our outdoor learning session at Forest School. We created roadways, built 'Roly Poly' Cities, dug holes, created patterns, found many treasures, and worked together to make a slide. Students developed their social, communication, thinking, and self-management skills.









Digital Citizenship in Grade 2

This week, Grade 2 discussed online safety and talked about some of the benefits and dangers of using the internet. This was the first of our Digital Citizenship lessons and we will continue to develop our skills, knowledge, and understanding, as we become more digitally literate learners. We exchanged ideas about 'What is the internet?' and then we tried to draw a representation of our thinking.









Grade 3 News

This week in grade 3 we finished our inquiry into addition and subtraction patterns. We worked in groups to find a specific subtraction equation and then looked for other equations that worked in the same way. Then while colouring them in the subtraction fact table we saw even more patterns and could predict which ones to colour next. This week we also had a chance to meet our Grade 1 buddies. We learned their names and made a



video on Seesaw together to introduce each other. It was a lot of fun and we had to use our communication and social skills to be successful. We look forward to our next buddy time.







Piano Competition Success

Introducing

Each week we catch up with a member of our ISB faculty to learn more about who they are, who inspires them and what they like to do in their spare time. This week we met Grade 4 Teacher **Taariq Amaan.**

Qualification and certifications: I have a Post-Graduate Certificate in Education from the University of Sunderland, and a BA in Business Admin from the University of Bedfordshire. I also have certifications for Teaching in English in Multilingual Classrooms, and will be receiving additional certifications from the IB next month.

What is your role at ISB? I am a PYP Homeroom Teacher in Grade 4. I also run a Photography ASA and coach Basketball.



Our community really is an international community! Where would you say you're from and where else have you lived? I am from Sri Lanka, and my wife and I moved to Korea in 2020. I've travelled a fair bit, but this was our first experience living outside of home and it has been fantastic!

What inspired you to become a teacher? I've always enjoyed learning and teaching let me cultivate a sense of purpose, along with a chance to make a greater positive impact.

What is your educational philosophy? My teaching philosophy is centered on empowering learners to question narratives, think critically, and develop resilience. I believe in fostering a learning environment where young people are encouraged to be humble in victory, graceful in defeat, and unafraid to take risks.





What made you choose ISB? The sense of community and the opportunity to play a versatile role in students' education. ISB had a welcoming atmosphere that immediately made me feel at home. It is a smaller, close-knit



community where everyone often takes on multiple roles, which I think creates an atmosphere of teamwork. Despite being an elementary teacher, I've had opportunities to work with students from all sections of the school, making my school year quite dynamic and interesting.

What is the best part of your job? Seeing my students grow, both academically and personally; witnessing their progress and development over time is genuinely rewarding.

What are your hobbies and interests? I definitely have a collector's gene and have

so many things I am interested in! Maybe too many? But some things I definitely enjoy are photography, motorsports and martial arts. I am a petrolhead at heart - I love cars and motorcycles!

What is your favourite quote? "Real wisdom is not the knowledge of everything, but the knowledge of which things in life are necessary, which are less necessary, and which are completely unnecessary to know." - Tolstoy

Who is your most memorable teacher and why? Funnily enough, my most memorable teacher has to be my 4th-grade teacher, Ms. Clarice. Maybe it's because I never really grew out of the 4th-grade mindset that I can relate to my students so well? :) I will never forget Ms. Clarice's kindness.
