

First Sports-Based House Activity of the School Year

Last week, our first sports-based house event was a huge success! Kindergarten to Grade 1 students enjoyed an exciting game of Cops and Robbers on the elementary playground. Grade 2 and 3 students competed in a thrilling 4-goal football match on the middle school basketball court, while Grades 4 and 5 played an energetic game of Futsal on the football field. The event promoted teamwork, sportsmanship, and a healthy, active lifestyle. It was an afternoon filled with happy, healthy fun, and our students gave it their all!









Grade 1 Focus on Maths in the Environment

As part of our transportation unit, the Grade 1 students took their maths learning outside this week! We ventured to the road in front of the school to observe and count different types of vehicles. The students used tally marks to track how many trucks, buses, motorbikes, and other vehicles passed by. They then recorded their findings on a chart they created in a previous math lesson.

Back in the classroom, students used their data to create a bar graph based on the vehicles they saw on the road. In addition to tallying, the students explored different types of graphs, such as bar graphs, line graphs, pie charts, picture graphs, and Venn diagrams, learning how to organize and display data in a fun way!

Forest School: A Journey

Forest School at ISB started in 2021 with just Kindergarten students participating, now it has grown to include EY2 and Grade 1. This has led to students being able to take risks, refine and modify their play, and extend their inquiries in the same place over an extended period of time. An example of this has been students who, since they were in EY2, have been building their den/ house at the secret base and then under the big rock.

It has involved a core group of students who continue to modify the design to make it stable while others have joined for a time. This involves talking about bigger rocks on the bottom, using a range of materials such as sticks, rocks, bricks, and working together to move heavy things into position. Students have also begun using cardboard to drag heavy things which related to the systems thinking in a unit of inquiry.


Eco Initiatives at ISB
