Korean Language and Literature

For the annual Chuseok Celebration (the Korean harvest festival celebrated on the fifteenth of the eighth lunar month), the Korean Language & Literature students explored diverse Chuseok activities and demonstrated their learning in various formats.

In middle and high school Korean Language and Literature, we learned about the meaning of Chuseok and explored the customs of Chuseok, including ancestral rites (차례). We also had an enjoyable time experiencing traditional games such as wrestling (씨름), arrow throwing (투호 던지기), tug-of-war (줄다리기), kicking a shuttlecock (재기차기), playing top-spinning (딱지치기), and flying kites (연날리기). We spent time explaining common knowledge about Chuseok and had a quiz session to test our understanding in Assembly. It was a valuable time for students who didn't know much about Chuseok, as we provided them with information through engaging activities.









Korean B Language Acquisition

Grade 10 Korean B students learned about Chuseok, the Korean traditional celebration. They were enthusiastic to share their learning with the secondary students to demonstrate their respect for Korean culture. During the presentation during the assembly, teachers and students both enjoyed learning how Koreans celebrate. They also experienced traditional games together.







Secondary School Team Building Trip Grade 6 & 7 Trip - Jinha Beach Ulsan

The Grades 6 and 7 travelled to Jinha Beach, Ulsan for a day of team building and critical and creative thinking. The weather stayed overcast all day which was a bonus for us to complete all activities.

The day started with the 'human knot' which tested their communication and thinking skills.

They then went into the 'silent order' activity which really tested them in terms of not talking- something Grades 6 and 7 usually find difficult. The students then excelled in the 'sheet flip' with most groups being able to do this without much trouble. The 'crocodile crossing' saw greater teamwork and cooperation with









students really having to help each other across the 'crocodile infested waters'. The final activity, however, really tested them: the 'spider web'. Not only did they have to use their critical thinking skills, but also, planning and really having to work as a team.

The feedback about the day, from the students, was very positive and they seemed to have really enjoyed the day away from school. Some students found that their personal boundaries were tested as well as their collaboration skills with students they did not know. For the most part, they were challenged, co-operative and clearly showed that they are capable of sustained teamwork.

Grade 8 Trip

The grade 8 students, along with their teachers, took on the challenge of hiking the Igidae Park Coastal Walk. This is a scenic track that follows the coastline with amazing views of Gwangalli, Haeundae and the East Sea. The day was just right for this trek, not too hot with clear views of the wonderful surroundings. The journey was completed in around 2 ½ hours and ended at the information centre adjacent to Oryukdo. After a quick stop for refreshments we then travelled to the United Nations Memorial Cemetery.



This was an opportunity to focus on the service and legacy of the many who had contributed so much to the development of South Korea as we know it today. The cemetery is incredibly well manicured and presents a great opportunity for our students to reflect on the importance of Service. The day was fun, thoroughly enjoyed by all and introduced some new experiences to the students.







Grade 10 Trip

We are thrilled to share the exciting moments from our recent Grade 10 team building trip to Gimhae Gaya Theme Park. The day was filled with adventure, collaboration, and unforgettable experiences that brought our students closer together.

One of the day's highlights was Korea's first-ever "Exciting Cycle," a thrilling activity that involves riding bicycles on a single rope, suspended 22 metres above the ground. The exhilarating zip line added an extra dose of adrenaline to our adventure. But the excitement didn't stop there! Our students also had the opportunity to conquer the "Exciting Tower," a



daring adventure-leisure facility with 72 challenging obstacle courses. Scaling this 20-metre-wide, 15-metre-high structure pushed their limits, stimulating their sense of adventure and desire for play.



For those seeking a more creative outlet, a few of our students participated in a ceramics class. Using a pottery wheel, they designed beautiful ceramic creations to take home as lasting memories of their day. Overall, the day was a resounding success, filled with laughter, camaraderie, and cherished memories. It provided a much-needed break from the classroom and allowed our students to relax and spend quality time with their peers. As teachers, we were equally delighted to see our students in a different light, thriving outside of their academic pursuits.





Grade 11 CAS Retreat and Team Building

Our grade 11 students took part in the action phase of their first major CAS experience, intended to introduce them to the program. They worked together to create a mural, each completing an individual section and then combining them to become a larger picture. The final product will be presented to Mr. Buck and then hung in the DP Room for current and future students to enjoy. After the mural making, the students enjoyed a pizza lunch and joined the grade 12s for some mixed bowling so that they can get to know each other better.







Grade 12 Teambuilding

During the recent grade 12 teambuilding day the students went to Gwangalli Beach for the first part of the day, where they learned to paddleboard. Despite choppy seas, the students really enjoyed the experience and many of them were able to stand and paddle for short distances. In the afternoon the students joined the grade 11's at a bowling alley in Jansang for a few competitive rounds of bowling. It gave them a chance to socialise with each other in an informal setting.







College Corner

<u>Grade 12:</u> October is a busy month for our G12 students! They are working very hard to meet their early university application deadlines. There are multiple steps involved and a lot of focus and dedication are required to complete this process. The College Counselor's priority this and next month is to spend one on one time with grade 12 students to support them with their applications and prepare important documentation that will be sent to universities.

<u>Grade 11</u>: Grade 11 students met with the College Counselor last month to start their university planning process and understand how the Recommendation Letter process works. We will meet again this month, to embark on the career and university exploration process and start looking at important university planning steps.

<u>Grade 10:</u> Grade 10 students met with the College Counselor last month to look at important university planning information and start the career and university exploration process through the Cialfo platform. Cialfo is a university and career planning platform that all ISB students 9-12 have access to. At our next

meeting this month, we will continue to explore the resources on Cialfo, focusing particularly on career exploration.

Developing Healthy Device Usage Habits

Greetings from the Counseling Office! Electronic devices have become an integral part of our lives. Smartphones, tablets, smartwatches, computers, these are all around us, most of the time. There are moments when our devices offer numerous benefits and contribute to our productivity, connection and entertainment, and other times when we might feel that they are getting in the way of family life, rest, and other personal pursuits and interests. Helping ourselves and our children manage our screen time and cultivating a healthy relationship with our devices is important. I would like to share three articles from Common Sense Media to support this idea.



The ultimate goal is to protect and increase the wellbeing of our family and help our children learn how to approach these tools in a positive, healthy and responsible way. An effective approach is to do this through conversation and family discussions, where everyone is involved and where everyone's opinions are heard and taken into account. Then, together, as a family, you can work on reaching some agreements that everyone has helped to create, and that everyone will be expected to honour.
