In Grade 10, Haruhi created a delightful children's storybook titled *Rugi the Seagull's Busan Adventure*. The story follows Rugi, a curious seagull, as she explores some of Busan's most famous tourist spots. The book is filled with charming illustrations and educational content, making it a joy for young readers. This was a major part of the IB curriculum's Personal Project, where Haruhi's creativity and dedication really shone through.

Haruhi's work caught the eye of Roman Kardashov, the General Manager of Park Hyatt Busan, who was so impressed that he invited her to collaborate on a new project. 




Well done Haruhi! Copies of the sticker book will soon be available to view in the school reception and early years and elementary school libraries.



#### International School of Busan Celebrates Outstanding IB Diploma Results for 2024!

Over the summer holiday, over 190,000 students worldwide received their International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme (DP) exam results. We are thrilled to announce that ISB students achieved exceptional results with a 100% pass rate and an average score of 34.83 points. This surpasses the global average of 30.32 points. This marks yet another year of outstanding performance, as ISB students have consistently scored above the world average for the ninth year in row. We wish our graduates every success as they begin their studies at universities across the globe. Our heartfelt thanks go out to the entire Diploma teaching team for their support and dedication to our students.

#### From the Head of School

It's great to be back! We are delighted to welcome 76 new students to ISB for the start of the 2024-25 academic year. We remain truly international, with new students representing 17 different nationalities: Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Japan, Korea, Nigeria, Norway, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Spain, the UK, and the USA.

Looking ahead, we have several key goals for the year. It will be a period dedicated to reflection, review, and planning as we prepare self-study reports for both CIS/WASC and the IB, in preparation for a comprehensive synchronised school evaluation visit in October 2025.

Additionally, we plan to engage with all members of the ISB community (parents, teachers, students, support staff and board members) to develop strategic goals that will align with the next cycle of accreditation (2025-2029). We also plan to review and update key policies, with a particular focus on ethical AI use. We are excited to host IB Asia Pacific Regional Workshops for the first time in April 2025 and to continue renovating and redeveloping our learning spaces to better support our students' learning and wellbeing. Our (Board approved) **Whole School Goals** for the year are as follows:

- Complete and submit a comprehensive self-study report for the CIS/WASC Accreditation Visit in October 2025.
- 2. Complete and submit a comprehensive self-study report for the Synchronised IB 5 Year Reauthorization Visit in October 2025.
- 3. Work collaboratively with all members of the ISB community to develop new strategic intents to align with the next cycle of accreditation/authorization (2025-2029).
- 4. Complete the Evaluation Report and application process to successfully bid for a five year Campus management Contract extension with the Busan Metropolitan City.
- 5. Review and update the ISB Language Policy to ensure full alignment with current IB guidelines, standards and practices.
- 6. Review and update the ISB Academic Integrity Policy and Digital Citizenship agreements to ensure that ethical Artificial Intelligence use is embedded in our academic practices and that we are fully aligned with current IB guidelines, standards and practices.
- 7. Review and update the ISB Assessment Policy to ensure that purposeful Artificial Intelligence use is embedded in our academic practices and that we are fully aligned with current IB guidelines, standards and practices.
- 8. Review and update the ISB Inclusion Policy to ensure full alignment with current IB guidelines, standards and practices.
- 9. Successfully organise and host the International Baccalaureate (IB) Asia Pacific Training Event from 11th-13th April, 2025
- 10. Redevelop our learning spaces to ensure that they best meet the needs of our learners and support our stated aims as outlined in the Guiding Statements.

#### **Campus Improvements**


This summer, we have made more improvements to our campus: Two additional science labs have been redesigned for enhanced learning; the Elementary play area now features a new safety surface; a new PE storage facility and spectator platform have been built adjacent to the sports field; and a new seating area in the car park improves pick-up and drop-off. Additionally, new devices have been purchased for Elementary students - they are now housed in new mobile carts that feature UV sterilising, custom charging, and RFID locking.








#### **PYP Sports Camp**


