Our Guiding Statements say that we will contribute responsibly to a sustainable future, be principled global citizens and take care of the environment. To align with this, one of the main objectives from the 2020-2024 Strategic Plan was to "Collaboratively review, plan and implement measures to lessen ISB's environmental footprint". As part of this plan, last year, we installed solar panels on the roof of B Building and C Building.

Over the last few months we have generated more than 20% of our energy using solar power and made annual savings of KRW 12,000,000.

# **Building Evacuation and Lockdown Drills**

Last week, we conducted a fire evacuation drill, and I am pleased to report that the entire school community responded exceptionally well. All students and staff exited the building promptly and were accounted for in just 5 minutes. This week, we carried out a lockdown drill. This drill is crucial for scenarios where remaining indoors is the safest course of action. I am happy to share that everyone followed the procedures correctly, demonstrating calmness and cooperation throughout the exercise. These drills ensure our school community is prepared to respond quickly and efficiently in real-life emergencies. After each drill, we share a feedback form with our staff to collect suggestions for improvements. This feedback is thoroughly reviewed by our leadership and management teams, allowing us to continually refine our procedures and maintain the highest safety standards. We encourage you to discuss these drills with your children, reinforcing the importance of taking them seriously and following all instructions from teachers and staff.

I am excited to report that our Season 1 After School Activities program, offering a wonderful variety of engaging opportunities for our students, has begun! # Grade 1 Assembly: Our School is a Family

They have identified that it is important to listen to others, share their ideas, share materials, along with taking turns. They are delving into understanding the difference between what people need to survive and what helps them to thrive and linking these ideas to real-world issues of inequality. We are excited to see their curiosity grow as they explore this important, thought-provoking topic!



# Inquiry into Our Emotions: Through Playing with Different Friends and Social Interaction

This week, our Early Years children have been deeply engaged in an inquiry into emotions through play and social interactions. Through play experiences, the EY 2 children are exploring and expressing their emotions in various social contexts. They learn to recognize and articulate their feelings, whether they are playing alone, with familiar friends, or in new group settings.

The EY 2 Children's play preferences reflect their unique learning processes and social interactions. Some enjoy exploring new friendships and engaging with different peers, which helps them learn flexibility and adaptability. Others prefer the comfort of playing with familiar friends, fostering deeper connections and understanding within those relationships. Some children may choose to play alone to focus on personal interests, while others thrive in group settings, learning collaboration and sharing.



These preferences also connect to their emotional development. Playing with various friends helps children understand and express their feelings in different social contexts, while consistent playmates can provide a sense of security and support. Understanding these dynamics helps us support their growth in both social and emotional areas. This experience is connected to our unit, How We Express Ourselves, which focuses on emotions. We will continue to

offer opportunities for children to play with different friends, as this approach supports their social and emotional growth, helping them develop essential skills in both areas.



# **Grade 3 Mathematics Inquiry**

Grade 3 have started a new unit on concept-based mathematics, where students explore mathematical ideas through hands-on activities and real-world applications. This method encourages students to focus on key mathematical ideas, promoting a deeper understanding beyond just memorising procedures. This week was also our MAP testing week for the first semester. The MAP tests establish benchmarks and growth in areas of Math, Language use and Reading for our students. Because we test at the beginning and end of the school year, we can measure student growth over the school year as well as any potential learning loss over the summer. We also use these results to tailor learning experiences and potentially fill learning gaps. Although the testing represents an interruption of our regular schedule and classes, we believe that this cost is worth it due to the valuable learning information we are able to glean from the results. ### Grade 12 ISB Student turns Journalist


Grade 12 student Antonio has recently published an article with media outlet HAPS Korea, as part of his
