

From the Head of School

Professional Development at ISB

Our staff gathered on Monday for a full day of professional development. The morning sessions were dedicated to advancing our IB and <u>CIS Accreditation</u>
Self-Study Reports in preparation for our school evaluation visit in October 2025. In the afternoon, teachers attended three 'Teachers Teaching Teachers' workshops centred on effectively leveraging artificial intelligence into teaching and learning practices. These sessions were led by teachers actively involved in a <u>Community of Practice</u> that has been exploring AI tools and strategies. Meanwhile, our non-academic staff participated in training provided by an external expert on implementing the <u>Personal Information Protection Act</u> (PIPA).

The professional development day also included a session that focused on the development of our new strategic plan, which will be implemented from August 2025. We reviewed the responses from the strategic planning survey which was sent out to the ISB community last month (including responses from parents, teachers, students, support staff and board members). Key themes emerging from the strategic plan survey responses include a strong emphasis on Experiential and Outdoor Learning, Physical Education, Facility Development and Well-being for students, staff, and teachers. Additionally, Sound Financial Management, Inclusive Education, and Language Support were identified as top priorities. The responses also highlight a recurring interest in Technology Integration (with an AI focus), Academic Excellence, and Staff Evaluation & Appraisal suggesting these areas warrant significant attention and resources. These themes will now be developed into actionable strategic objectives that will be reviewed and approved by the Board of Governors.

Kindergarten Storytelling


Inspired by the work of Vivian Gussen Paley, who says that storytelling and fantasy play can significantly impact a child's academic and social growth, our Kindergarten class is diving deep into the world of storytelling! Each day, one student gets to share their unique tale with Ms. Caro. These stories can be as short as they like and no longer than a page.

Ms. Caro writes down the student's words in our Story Journal, capturing our ideas. Then, the real magic happens! We bring the story to life through our acting skills where we take on varied roles such as students, pieces of Lego, and the classroom.

This process allows us to:

- **Develop our oral language skills:** Sharing our stories aloud builds confidence and vocabulary.
- Explore our creativity: There are no limits to our imaginations.
- Strengthen our listening skills: Paying close attention to our classmates' stories is key.
- Experience the joy of collaborative storytelling: Everyone plays a part in bringing the story to life.

The ISB Cross-Country Teams travelled to the Dansan Reservoir in Daegu to compete in the SKAIS Finals. There were a lot of nervous and excited butterflies before the race, but the weather was perfect and the Bears were in great form after a season of challenging workouts. The races were started in quick succession making the action of the day fast and furious.

First out of the gates were the elementary runners, with the ISB boys quickly dominating the field. In the end, it was a photo finish with Birk just edging out Han to finish 1st and second and securing the first team trophy of the day. The elementary girls also did ISB proud with lots of speedy bears with big smiles on their faces as they flew around the course.

The high school boys set off at a quick pace and ISB was right at the front the whole race. In the end, Adrian took individual gold while a gusty finish from Patrick and a bold kick from Daniel helped the Bears earn the HS Boys team trophy. The high school girls started just minutes after the boys and ISB stole the show again with Taehee, Yuri, and Yuna finishing 2nd, 3rd, and 4th respectively locking down another team trophy for ISB.



Middle school was up next, led by a challenging boys race complicated by the high school runners still out on the course. However, the boys persevered and the team of Kensei (who finished 3rd), Aiden, Yunsung, and Shinji captured another team trophy to bring home. Right behind them was the middle school girls team. Morgan put on an impressive performance leading the pack from the first few steps through to a gold medal finish. All in all, when the dust off the trails settled, ISB had earned 4 team trophies and 8 individual medals. How to Order Online

- <u>Coupang</u>: Look for MSC-certified options by searching for "MSC 인증 수산물" (MSC-certified seafood). Coupang offers various options, including frozen fish fillets and ready-to-cook dishes.
- Market Kurly: Known for its high-quality food, Market Kurly has an array of MSC-certified seafood options. Just type "MSC" in the search bar to discover sustainable seafood choices.
- **SSG.COM**: This site also stocks MSC-certified items, often labeled clearly in product descriptions. SSG.COM provides a variety of seafood, from salmon to shellfish, so you can support sustainable fishing with each purchase.

💡 Sustainable Tips When Ordering

- Order in Bulk: Reduce packaging waste by buying in larger quantities or family packs.
- Choose Freezer-Friendly Options: Ordering frozen MSC fish not only minimizes spoilage but also ensures you have sustainable seafood ready whenever you need it!
- Avoid Air Freight: If possible, choose ground shipping for a lower carbon footprint. Many online retailers will specify this in the shipping options.

It is also important to dedicate time for self-care and prioritize our own mental well-being by practicing stress-reduction techniques such as mindfulness, relaxation, breathing, or exercise, for example.
